

Dear Friends.

September is Suicide Awareness Month and it's, perhaps, the biggest awareness month for USA Cares outside of any time set aside to remember and recognize our military and its veterans. To date, we have lost more than 30,000 service members and veterans to suicide since 9/11, four times the number we've lost in combat. Even more troublesome is the recent data, released this April, that shows the VA's Veterans Crisis Line fielded a record of more than 88,000 calls, texts, and chats in the month of March.

The statistics related to suicide among service members and veterans are staggering, and I'm often met with shock and concern when I share them with people while representing USA Cares. The issue, though, is too many are doing what our new staff member, Rick, calls "admiring the problem." (Meet him and the rest of our HVRP staff in our News section below.)

The good news is the work of USA Cares has a real and important effect on veteran suicide, and our supporters have already made an impact on military families all over the country. Jesus, featured in the story above, reminds us that financial crises can happen to all types of veterans, regardless of location or background.

I want to share my gratitude for the work of our Gala Committee, and for all those that attended our 20th Anniversary Gala in August. We were humbled by the outpouring of support and look forward to assisting many more veteran and military families because of it.

Helping USA Cares provide that assistance, however, does not require big checks or formal events. Our News section is full of opportunities for everyone to play a part in the USA Cares mission. 
USA Cares Receives \$150,000 Grant from DAV



USA Cares is honored to work with Disabled American Veterans again this year to provide life changing support for America's veterans. Through a grant received from the

DAV Charitable Service Trust, USA Cares will be able to protect at least 75 additional U.S. military veterans, active-duty service members, and their families from factors which put them at risk of suicide.
